Health related: Working on two new health related situations. One is a tenant/landlord dispute and the other is a request from the Department of Children and Families to be involved in determining the appropriateness of a foster care home.

Landlock property: A house located near the old Depot is considered land locked. We will need to meet to consider options for resolution if that is possible. I have spoken to the owner several times, the VT Railroad division and others so far.

Bayley Hazen Road: I met with Larry Hamel to discuss easements for straightening BHR where it meets Route 16 in East Hardwick. We will need to determine if this project can or should be done this year.

64 North Main: Stormwater treatment project. I am working on the necessary easement for construction and maintenance.

Water/wastewater delinquencies: There are approximately 83 households that are delinquent for water and wastewater, amounting to a deficit of \$64,000 for both accounts. A notice for disconnection and tax sale is going out of the Town Clerk's office immediately.

Private Road Name Change

Hardwick currently has a Sawmill Lane and a Sawmill Road (private). There have been numerous mail/package issues with this name being so close and in the same Town. Sawmill Lane was in existence first.

I have spoken to the E-911 coordinator at the State of Vermont, and he said that the road name can be changed if the Select Board approves it. While there would be some temporary issues until the new address becomes known in databases, it is the best solution for the long term.

There are 4 houses on the road, one of which is vacant. The other 3 residents have mutually agreed that they would like to change the name of the road to Landing Way and are seeking your approval, so they can move forward with getting it changed through the 911 and mailing systems.

They originally wanted Independence Lane but changed their minds after the agenda was posted.
